Do students think General Education requirements are there just to jump through them before they get into their major? This needs to be changed. Maybe faculty need to show students how they have meaning concerning their major. Students and Faculty need to realize General Education classes are not just a box to check before you get on with your education.

Maybe have students upon leaving UND have a General Education portfolio. Make it a project-based credential. Investment in their education and have something tangible. "Process is the Point" thinking from down to up not up to down.

Discussed the notion that all excellence doesn't have to be applied and we should be careful about only emphasizing applied skills. Maybe create an appendix to our final report of what doesn't make it into the final report, as great ideas are being surfaced.
