

Cornhole (Bags) Rules

General

Players, Rosters, and Substitutions

- Games are played 2v2.
- Teams can consist of 3 rostered players, but only 2 can play in any game.

Equipment/Court Set-Up

- Boards and bags will be supplied by the Wellness Center.
 - These will be the only acceptable equipment for competition. No personal boards/bags can be used, unless granted by the Coordinator of Campus Recreation.
- Boards will be set up approx. 27 ft. apart.
 - When taking place in the Wellness Center Main Gym or MAC, place the back legs on the side out-of-bounds lines for the volleyball courts.
- Each team will have one player beside each board.
- If teams cannot decide which side they will toss from, flip a coin to decide who chooses.

The Game

- Matches will be played best 2 out of 3.
- Every match is broken down into innings of play.
 - During an inning of play, each player must pitch all four of their bags.
- When throwing the bag, a player must not step over the foul line (the front of the board).
- The player or team who scored in the preceding inning pitches first in the next inning.
 - If neither player or team scores, the player or team who pitched first in the preceding inning shall retain first pitch.
- Players must pitch with an underhand release.
- Players must pitch all of their bags from their designated side of the board for the entirety of the game.

Scoring

- Bags (cornhole) uses cancellation scoring. The smallest score for that inning is subtracted from the highest score. That number of points is awarded to the player/team who scored the highest amount of points that inning.
 - Only one player/team can score in each inning.
- **Bag In-The-Count (Woody):** Any bag which comes to rest anywhere on top of the board. Each is worth one (1) point.
- **Bag In-The-Hole (Cornhole):** Any bag which is thrown through the hole or knocked through the hole by another bag. Each is worth three (3) points.
- **The first team to reach EXACTLY 21 points is the winner.**
 - **If a team's score exceeds 21 following a round, their score will be reduced to 13.**

Fouls Bag Rule Violations

- The following are rule violations that must be spotted and called by a player or assigned judge:
 - Any bag pitched when the player has made contact with or crossed over the foul line
 - A bag pitched from a different pitcher's box than the first bag
 - Any bag that contacted the court or the ground before coming to rest on the board
 - Any bag that struck a previously defined object such as a tree limb, wire, indoor court ceiling, etc.
 - Any bag removed from the board before scoring has been agreed upon for that bag
 - The offending team (who touches the bags) forfeits all remaining bags and tallies the score of just the bags thrown before the foul was reported.
 - The non-offending team tallies twelve (12) points as if they had thrown four Bag In-The-Holes (Cornholes) during the inning.
 - A bag that leaves a player's hand once the final forward swing of the delivery process has started shall count as a pitched bag.
 - A bag that is accidentally dropped by a player before the final forward swing has started shall not be considered foul and may be picked up and pitched.
- **The penalty is to declare the bag a foul bag, which requires the bags to be removed from the court prior to resuming play.**

Miscellaneous

- **Games will be self-governed.**

- Scores will need to be reported via Fusion IM's or emailed to the Coordinator of Campus Recreation within 24 hours of the match concluding.
